The Dock is Complete!





After our contractor completed the water portion of the dock in August, in September about ten volunteers over the course of three weeks constructed the land portion of the dock! Its 1.5x wider than the previous dock, has a larger platform at the end, and with its construction should last for the next generation of children, youth, and adults at Walter Scott. With the dock complete, our beach updates are not done entirely, but the largest project is. Fixing the aerator, rebuilding the beachfront, updating storage for watercraft and the life jackets, and more still will be happening in the months ahead. By Summer 2026, our beach will look different, but still allow access to God's Creation on the water as it always has.

All are welcome. All means all.




We'll watch short videos, join in small-group discussions, and take part in hands-on activities to:

Quick Creation Care Tip

Regenerate! On a personal level, compost your food and lawn scraps; plant for pollinators; consider rewilding at least a portion of your property. On a larger scale, examine your agricultural practices (cover crops, low till, no chemicals...) for changes that will regenerate the fertility of the soil.
