Bathroom Renovations Underway




The main bathrooms at Walter Scott have served us well for many years, but with all things time takes its toll. Loose tiles, sagging wall coverings, and failing plumbing have been the story of these bathrooms the last few years. We are therefore extremely grateful to our friends at the Rekindle Foundation for their funding of our bathroom remodel!

Starting the day after our last event for the year, our contractors began demolition (saving as many materials for repurposing as they could) and will continue to remodel the bathrooms. Instead of a men's and women's bathroom, the new bathrooms will be four self contained individual bathrooms (sink and toilet) with one still featuring a shower. The bathrooms will also be more easily cleanable with a combination of tile and moisture-resistant paint.

We're excited to see the end product and are grateful this will continue to be a reflection of the hospitality of Christ to the many who come to our facility in the year's ahead.

We'll watch short videos, join in small-group discussions, and take part in hands-on activities to:


- Understand key climate science and impacts

This opportunity will provide hands-on education over five nights and four days with opening and closing forest church worship experiences. Meet the Neighbors!



Meet another one of our neighbors, Fungi! An entire branch of the tree of life, fungi come in all colors, shapes, sizes, and configurations. They're as varied as a woodpecker is from a blue whale in the animal kingdom and are everywhere! Some of the fungi here at Walter Scott decompose and recycle dead and decaying plant and animal matter, some function primarily as a nutrient transfer agent for trees, and others still exist just as mold and mildew. Fungi even are one half of the symbiotic and resilient lichen we see in grays, greens, and blues growing on tree bark.

Fungi are a necessary and wonderful part of God's Creation that help us and our beloved forest at Walter Scott to flourish. To better care for them, we can reduce our tilling of soil (which chops up their near invisible 'root' systems) and stop using fungicides on lawns. We can even help nature's recyclers by combatting invasive species that harm other parts of the ecosystem upon which they rely.

As stewards of God's Creation, we can only properly care for what we know, and a great place to start is learning a bit about our neighbors.
